have had a couple meetings since the SAT FR2004 to ensure we can take on this important task. I'm happy to report that the Dayton area FACs are committed to hosting FR2006, and we are already getting a head start in the planning for this event to take place in late September 2006. We will enjoy great weather, moderate temperatures and low humidity...a super time of the year. The Dayton Aviation Trail promises to be an important part of the Reunion and will include the following attractions and activities:

- The USAF Museum will be a prime attraction and it has continued to expand. It has added a Cold War exhibit in 2003. Of particular importance, it's added a much more human flavor to the exhibits then existed previously and gives a feeling of who the people were....it brings it alive! Maj Gen Metcalf, USAF, Ret., the Museum Director, and his staff continue to work to improve this important legacy to our aviation history. Gen Metcalf said that he has brought the O-1, O-2, OV-10, A-1 as well as the H-3 and the Huey into the same area of the museum.
- The National Aviation Hall of Fame, Carillon Historical Park, Wright Brothers Memorial, Huffman Prairie Flying Field, the Wright B Flyer, to name a few. Who knows, part of the venue may be to get an opportunity to fly the Wright B Flyer in addition to our Vietnam era FAC aircraft. Lot's of possibilities here.

The dedication of a FAC memorial at the USAF Museum will certainly be one of the centerpieces of the reunion....The museum has from one to two million visitors annually and I can't think of a better place to have an enduring memorial to the FAC mission. Precisely what

US INFANTRYMEN CREATE AWARD FOR AUSSIE HERO (a real one)

The 5th Battalion, 60th Infantry (5/60) of the 9th Infantry Division (Old Reliable) had their annual Vietnam reunion on 17-20 June 2004 in Dallas, Texas. Some 160 members and their wives attended. The climax of the reunion was honoring **Flt Lt Garry Cooper, a Royal Australian Air Force Officer**, who flew USAF O-1, a single-engine light aircraft, as a Forward Air Controller (FAC) for their infantry unit in combat in 1968 near Saigon, Vietnam during the mini-TET. Cooper had been denied the Congressional Medal of Honor and/or the Victoria Cross because of bureaucratic technicalities.

Due to his schedule Flt Lt Cooper could not attend the reunion and one of the soldiers that owed Flt Lt Cooper his life accepted the citation and plaque. Excerpts from the citation for Flt Lt Garry Cooper (RAAF & Vietnam Veteran) read as follows:

"There are a lot of genuine heroes in this room, men who did

extraordinary things under extraordinary circumstances. I don't have the time to tell you all of their stories but tonight I am going to take the time to tell you one.

This is the amazing tale of our Australian friend, Garry Cooper.

Garry arrived in Vietnam in 1968 as a member of the Royal Australian Air Force. He was a Forward Air Controller (FAC)....

In May of 1968 elements of the 5th/60th found themselves just on the southern edge of Saigon at a fight which came to be known as the Battle of the Y-Bridge....

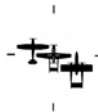
In addition to bringing in effective supporting fire, his actions irritated the enemy soldiers enough that he started to attract his usual amount of heavy fire....Directly due to his actions, the tide of battle was shifted. The beleaguered companies were able to break the ambush and route the enemy. Many wounded men were able to be medivac-ed instead of being stuck on the ground through a long, long night.

Garry, this award is not the Victoria Cross or the Congressional Medal of Honor but neither is it being given to you by the stuffed shirts in Washington or by the bureaucrats in Canberra. It is being given by the ground-pounding, grunt soldiers who were there, who saw and know what you did. There are men in this room this evening that are alive today because of your bravery. We thank you and we honor you."

The plaque read as follows:

The 5th Battalion, 60th Infantry Association Present this Distinguished Service Award to Garry Cooper for Extraordinary Heroism with the Profound thanks of the many men whose lives you saved. Presented June 19th 2004.

5/12/2004 - **WASHINGTON** – A former Forward Air Controller who began his military career as a Marine Corps rifleman in 1962 is retiring for the second time.

Lt. Col. Theron Sims, who is on terminal leave, rejoined the Air Force on May 15, 2002, as part of the Rated Officer Recall Program. Colonel Sims was the service's senior lieutenant colonel, with an Oct. 1, 1983, date of rank.

The colonel originally retired from active duty Jan. 1, 1989.

He returned to the Air Force following the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.

“We asked what we could do to help,” he said.

The answer came in the form of an e-mail from the commander of 8th Air Force at Barksdale Air Force Base, La.

“He said he was having a pilot shortage, that he didn't have enough pilots and navigators to man the combined air operations center,” Colonel Sims said. “He said if I'd come back and work in the CAOC, he could take a pilot out and put him back in the cockpit.”

Colonel Sims spent six months as the CAOC's chief of the time-sensitive targeting branch. One of the operations he “pushed” was the first combat strike using a new automated deep-operations coordination system.

Colonel Sims is one of 208 former active-duty officers who returned to duty through the recall program.

- From 66 years and up: \$150

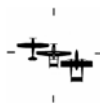
I encourage you to join me in subscribing to this option by sending your check to Treasurer George Ferkes today.

RUSTIC WAR BIRD, OV-10 # 639, TO BE PRESERVED; ITS HISTORY RECORDED: (by Darrel Whitcomb, FAC Historian): Great news OV-10 drivers! The Aussies just announced at the San Antonio FAC reunion that OV-10 tail number 67-14639 is going to be placed in the Australian National War Memorial in Canberra. The aircraft was built in Aug 1968 and flew in Vietnam, Thailand, Germany, Korea, and at Shaw AFB. It was decommissioned in 1991. If you flew any missions in this bird, please provide me with the details.

STEVE HOPKINS HONORS RUSTIC KIA'S IN HIS "RUN FOR THE WALL" (RFTW)

A couple months ago, Steve Hopkins called me wanting to know where he could obtain a Rustic baseball cap and Rustic logo pin. He explained that he wanted them for his "Run to the Wall" ride. I can testify that Steve found a hat and pin! He also made it to the Vietnam War Memorial Wall.

I asked Steve to tell us more about his RFTW experience. Here's his reply.
"Don't know if you have broadband, but check out www.rftw.org. It was absolutely awesome. We jumped off in LA with about 400+ bikes. About 2/3's do the central route and the rest were with us on the southern route. It's a 10 day ride, with 20 stops at VA hospitals, memorials, and schools. We talk to kids, vets, you name it. All along the way, people are on the overpasses with flags and signs, or just one vet in part of a uniform will be standing there holding a salute while we ride under the overpass. Not a dry

eye in the crowd. I can't begin to describe it. Last year I rode up to Chattanooga, TN and did the last 3 days, plus the Rolling Thunder Demonstration. Recommend that for the first time out.

All the info you need is on the web site. As a side note, Run For The Wall is a corporation, not affiliated with Rolling Thunder, which is a different national association of bike clubs who actually put on the Demonstration in DC (don't let them hear you call it a parade - it's meant to be in Congress' face to get accounting for all the MIA's). When we reach DC we become part of RT, but there are about 400-500,000 bikes total. We had about 700 at the end this year.

I hooked up last yr with an ex-Nail and an ex-Marine and we rode down the eastern seaboard together afterwards. They ride the full round trip every year. Both are retired AAL pilots.
