Greetings all, I have a recently widowed lady contacting me through Romad.com as her husband was attached to a TACP unit during Vietnam. I have limited data for that period but she is attempting to get more information on what he did while in (1970-1971) and get his ribbon rack squared away for internment. He has 3 DD214s for some weird reason: The first one (the first 3 years) shows foreign service 1 year 3 months 12 days. The second one (the first 6 years) shows foreign service of 2 years 2 months 24 days. The third and final shows no foreign service. I have never seen anyone get more than one for the same service period.

Anyway, She would like to talk to anyone that may have known him as he would not talk about his time there.

AFSC was 42153 Aerospace Ground Engineer.
He had a Black Beret (well worn) with the Pacaf pin on it. TACP didn't get Flash and crest until the 80's so that makes sense, we worn jump wings and all sorts of things in the meantime.

His full name was Ralph Michael Wong
